Bob retired from the Forest Service in 2005 after 29 years of service. Though most of his 4 years of retirement were spent battling A.L.S., he gave his all to enjoying life. He never quit hoping. He met friends everywhere he went and knew no strangers.

#### INDEPENDENCE DAY PARADE



Stella James is a living legend in these parts of Northern California and the James Ranch continues to be an active contributor to our local economy. Stella, the daughter of stage coach driver Ed Ryan, was born in 1916 at the Sherwood Valley Inn, and ninety-four years later remains an active community member in the same Sherwood Valley.

Stella grew up learning about ranching, fencing, managing livestock and building homes and eventually became the capable young wife of Edgar James. The James family moved into the Sherwood Valley in 1919. Together, Stella and Edgar broke and trained horses, rode the range to tend cattle,

built fencing and built houses within

Sherwood Valley community. The James' not only worked their own ranch but also worked on a number of large ranches in the area. During that same period, Edgar worked at the last remaining Sherwood Mill while Stella cooked for the mill and ranch hands at Stempel Ranch.

In 1946, Stella's in-laws bought one square mile of the Sherwood Valley which included the Sherwood Town Depot and the Sherwood Inn where Stella was born. In 1948, charming Stella was crowned Rodeo Queen for the Redwood Fortuna Rodeo. Later, in 1950, during the Covelo Labor Day Rodeo, fire broke out in the Sherwood Valley. Fortunately, the Inn and hay were saved due to the back fire efforts of the local ranchers, but the fire wiped out every barn and fence in its path as well as many homes. The James family, along with members of the Grange helped fix the Inn and surrounding properties.

Stella remembers entertainment at the Sherwood School house where families gathered monthly for all night celebrations and children slept on top of desks while parents continue to dance to the music of guitar, violin, and harmonica. Women provided food and coffee, and musicians were rewarded through a collection taken up by the attendees.

Stella's husband Edgar passed on in 1984 and Stella continues to make her home in the beautiful Sherwood Valley. Stella and her family have been featured several times in the Willits News over the years. In the years 2000 and 2003, Stella was honored again with the Willits News features of her family heritage, and portrayal and sketch of the Sherwood Valley from 1919. Today way we honor Stella, a true cowgirl, whose life has been wilder than an eight second ride! Congratulations, Stella, our 2010 Willits Frontier Days Grand Marshal!




representing Future Farmers of America as an Advisor. Greg even coached basketball for five years during his tenure.





actually designed and made their costumes."

As with many of the volunteers who get involved with Frontier Days comes from a phone call requesting use of their expertise and in Dan's case it came with painting. When it became time to paint the bucking chutes, Arena fence, or the Willits Frontier Days Mascot and official greeter "Willie" Dan was the one to get the call. After a few years instead of waiting for the call Dan just started showing each year and did it.

During workdays Laura would show up and ask what she could do to help. Laura pulled weeds, watered plants, helped paint the grandstand seats, clean bathrooms too many other things. Laura always felt because she was lucky enough to be able to ride her horse in the arena, she should spend a little "sweat equity" work-

ing on the grounds.

Laura was also responsible for starting a new tradition by making her business deposit at the drive-up window at the Bank of Willits on her horse. To this day you will see Laura here early in the morning on July 3rd and 4th arraigning the box seat chairs to help take a little pressure off of the other volunteers who have been putting in long hours with little sleep.

As Kathy Goss said, "They are the kind of people that no one ever really notice-and yet when you were in a jam and need help-they are the first ones to show up." This stands as true today as it has over the past; what an honor and privilege to honor these two very special people.



# WILLITS FRONTIER DAYS Tistory

What has been billed as the longest continuous rodeo in the State of California, will once again be a featured attraction of the Willits Frontier Days Celebration in 2010. This year the 4th of July extravaganza represents 84 years of spirit, cooperation and pride in the community of Willits by its citizens.

In 1926, the Willits Development Association came up with the idea of sponsoring a community activity to raise funds for the construction of a much-needed hospital. Through the efforts of many prominent citizens including Dr. Raymond Babcock, Frank Taft, Judge E.M. Whitney, Judge Fred Foord,

Deed Wimmer, Frank and Bill Whitney, Joe Quadrio, Edward Morris, Carl Edenfeldt, Allen Sacry, the American Legion Post adopted the plan. The first Willits Frontier Days Rodeo occurred in July 1927.

It was at this time that Frank R. Howard, young son of Ridgewood Ranch owner Charles S. Howard, was fatally injured in an automobile accident while vacationing at the ranch. Dr. Babcock, who ministered to the injured boy before his death, approached Howard about erecting a hospital in Willits in memory of his son. Howard built the Frank R. Howard Memorial Hospital shortly thereafter.

Even though the original idea of having a rodeo to fund construction of a hospital was no longer necessary, the American Legion decided to carry on with their plans. They used the meager Willits Frontier Days profits to benefit the community in many other worthwhile ways.

The celebration was an instant success, and the American Legion ran the

show until 1932 when the Willits Volunteer Fire Department accepted the leadership role. Looking to the future, the Fire Department borrowed money to improve the rodeo grounds by having individual volunteer firefighters sign promissory notes.

The Willits Frontier Days Association was born and incorporated in 1950 when a group of local businessman and ranchers took over. The continuity of Willits Frontier Days remains unbroken since 1926.

A non-profit organization, Frontier Days still operates as it did in the beginning with no individual or organization getting any financial reward. Residents and clubs work together to put on the events and decide together how to spend the profits of each show to benefit our community.

The association works throughout the year to provide the maintenance and improvements to the property in order to enhance both the property and quality of the shows performed each year.

Bring your family and friends and join us on Monday, July 5th at 12 Noon. You just might catch a glimpse of a future big name in rodeo.





Back in the late 1920s, the community of Willits desperately needed a hospital to serve its residents. Willits Frontier Days was formed to help raise funds for the construction costs of the new facility. Charles Howard, owner of the famed racehorse Seabiscuit, served as the Grand Marshall of the first parade. Eighty years later, Willits is once again in need of a new hospital, and Willits Frontier Days is helping lead the charge.

The Frank R. Howard Foundation hosted a fundraising event called, "A Day at the Races" last August featuring hospital bed races, a BBQ, live music, and arts & crafts booths. Fourteen teams representing various community groups hurtled hospital beds down Haehl Creek Drive in a furious competition.

The hospital bed races served as the cornerstone of the event with each team eligible for prizes and recognition. Contests ranged from the bestdecorated bed to teams that raised the most money by collecting sponsorships



and donations. Due to the leadership of President Chris White, Willits Frontier Days won the best-decorated prize and was one of the top three fundraising teams.

As the Howard Foundation carries on its mission of creating the first rural "green" or LEED certified hospital and healthcare campus in the country, Willits Frontier Days remains committed to its original mission by supporting this important community investment. On August 15, 2009, the tradition will continue with the return of "A Day at the Races."

## RIDGEWOOD RANCH Home of Seabiscuit

Willits has, at one time or another, been called a "one-horse town," and that "one horse" was Seabiscuit. The horse was catapulted back into the international limelight through Laura Hillenbrand's New York Times best selling book "Seabiscuit: An American Legend," an Academy Award nominated motion picture, and worldwide news coverage about Seabiscuit's home Ridgewood Ranch. The incredible publicity brought people from around the world to Willits, and specifically to Ridgewood Ranch where jockey Red Pollard and Seabiscuit came to recuperate from injuries in 1939.

You're invited to spend some time at Ridgewood Ranch—home of many

historic buildings. A guided walking tour includes several buildings important to the Howard ranch operation. Stops along the tour include the upper mare barn with hand-penciled notes on stall walls about Seabiscuit's mates and offspring, and the house the Howards called home, with a special guest room set aside for crooner and horse race aficionado Bing Crosby.



The crown jewel of the tour is Seabiscuit's barn! Charles S. Howard had the barn constructed for Seabiscuit's homecoming after his triumphant win of the 1940 hundred-grander at Santa Anita. This structure was renovated by the Rotary Club of Willits, including its signature Howard logo and jockey and horse weather vane.

In addition, plans are being developed to preserve most of the historically significant buildings of this extraordinary ranch.

## Roots of Motive Power




Roots of Motive Power, Inc. acquires, restores and preserves steam logging and railroad artifacts of historical importance. Its collection of over 60 pieces of machinery ranges from small stationery engines to locomotives. One of the biggest attractions is a 1932 Bucyrus Erie Steam Shovel. Roots' members steam-up the restored equipment for community events, school groups, and special occasions. In the spring, summer and fall, Roots'

volunteers have workdays on the first and third Sundays of the month at the Mendocino County Museum.

After nearly 20 years, Roots of Motive Power in collaboration with the Mendocino County Museum and Mendocino College realized their "Redwood Empire Railroad History Project (RERHP)." Roots was first organized in 1982 and began with a single piece of equipment. The new RERHP building is a monument to superb woodwork construction. It has two railroad tracks within the building and provides over 5,000 square feet of display space in the "Engine House" for heavy steam-powered equipment. It was made possible with a "Transportation Enhancement Act" grant through the Mendocino Council of Government Office of Ukiah. To learn more, visit their web site at www.rootsofmotivepower.com.

## MENDOCINO COUNTY Museum



Mendocino County Museum is a regional "Community Storyteller." Explore our local history from its beginning. Follow the intriguing story of Mendocino County from the shipwreck that opened the region to logging and settlement in the 1850s, to a diverse way of life by viewing the inside of a '70s "hippie van." See Dr. Babcock's homemade movie of Mendocino County's most famous equine Seabiscuit. Enjoy the museum's exhibits of Pomo baskets, logging, wine making, commercial fishing and ranching.



### Wet & Wild Waterfights



As Dave Shelton recalls, the Annual Water Fight got started in the late 40s or early 50s to promote community awareness of the need for Volunteer Firefighters. The object of a water fight is to drive a barrel, by means of water pressure and hose handling skill, into your opponents' area.

Initially, the water fight was between Willits firefighters team and a firefighting team from Fort Bragg. They battled each other for a perpetual trophy—first in Willits on the 4th of July and then in Fort Bragg during Paul Bunyan Days. The match was the best two out of three, and was originally fought on East Commercial Street in front of Willits City Hall.

Dave remembers one year when he was Willits' nozzle man. He went head-to-head with Fort Bragg's nozzle man for three hours in just one of the rounds. In the end, they both collapsed with no winner declared. After that a time limit was set, and because of liability, the loose barrel was tethered (the loose barrel would sometimes end up in the crowd).
