community activity to raise funds for the construction of a much-needed hospital. Through the efforts of many prominent citizens, including Dr. Raymond Babcock, Frank Taft, Judge E.M. Whitney, Judge Fred Foord, Deed Wimmer, Frank and Bill Whitney, Joe Quadrio, Edward Morris, Carl Edenfeldt, Allen Sacry and the American Legion Post, a plan was hatched, and the first Willits Frontier Days Rodeo occurred in July 1927.

Coincidentally, at this same time, Frank R. Howard, the young son of Charles S. Howard, owner of Ridgewood Ranch and champion the future, the fire department borrowed racehorse Seabiscuit, was injured in an money to improve the rodeo grounds by automobile accident at the ranch. The boy's having individual volunteer firefighters sign doctor, Dr. Babcock, approached Howard promissory notes.

In 1926, the Willits Development Association about erecting a hospital in Willits in memory came up with the idea of sponsoring a of young Frank, who did not survive the fatal crash. Mr. Howard agreed and decided to build the Frank R. Howard Memorial Hospital shortly thereafter.

> Even though the original idea of having a rodeo to fund construction of a hospital was no longer necessary, the American Legion decided to carry on with their plans for the event anyway.

> The celebration was an instant success, and the American Legion ran the show until 1932. when the Willits Volunteer Fire Department accepted the leadership role. Looking to

The Willits Frontier Days Association was born and incorporated in 1950, when a group of local businessmen and ranchers took over the proverbial "reins" of the event. The continuity of Willits Frontier Days has remained unbroken since 1926.

As a non-profit organization, Willits Frontier Days still operates as it did in the beginning, with no associated individual or organization getting any financial reward. Residents and clubs work together to put on the events and decide together how to spend the profits of each show to benefit our community.

When not with the animals, Arkelian enjoys spending time playing basketball and softball and being a member of the Willits Frontier Days Juniors club.




The California Cowboys Pro Rodeo Association is a group of top-ranked cowgirls and cowboys who participate on a circuit of professional-grade rodeos throughout the state.

The contestants participate in eight events – bareback, saddle bronc, team roping, calf roping, steer wrestling, breakaway roping, barrel racing and bull riding – hoping to win the coveted All-Around title.

After the points from all the events are tallied, the cowgirl and cowboy with the highest cumulative scores win the title, a coordinating engraved buckle created at Outlaw Saddlery, a wad of cold hard cash, and bragging rights for the duration of the year.

The livestock for the events, the bulls, broncs and hornedalike – 'rodeo stock' as they are referred to in the trade – are provided byRockin' M Rodeo. The bulls and broncs give the boys a challenge to hang on to, and the steer and calves try to give the ladies a run for their money.

In addition to the eight CCPRA Rodeo events, cowboys and cowgirls from Lake, Mendocino and Humboldt counties can compete in local team roping events as well. Trophy buckles, also engraved by Outlaw Saddlery, are awarded to the top-scoring Header and Heeler.

The Jack Tharp Arena gets to serve a different use on Friday night, when the Truck and Tractor Pulls replace the bulls and broncs that usually inhabit the space.



When trying to decide what my stamp on Willits will be for future generations, I wonder, will it be our Willits Weekly newspaper? Will it be for having the cutest baby ever? But, what I really want is for it to be getting the 18-foot Cowboy Willy a lady friend -- by the 100th year anniversary of Willits Frontier Days in 2026.

Adding a pattern to her shirt or skirt would be an extra charge, as would be creating custom boots (\$2k-plus?), custom hat (\$3k-plus?) or belt buckle (\$800-plus?)

An additional \$1,000 is needed for delivery on the 16-foot flatbed trailer from the Bay Area to Willits. It is also suggested that she resides on a cement pad, ideally about 30 x 60, where her feet could be bolted to the ground, and the manufacturer also suggests additional bolts at her hips and/or shoulders for added stability.

The order needs to be placed with Bell Plastics 6 months before the delivery date: (order placed December 2025 to be installed by May/June 2026) with a 10% deposit being remitted at the order date, 50% of the balance being remitted by beginning of April/May 2026) and remainder of the balance due at pick-up or delivery (May/June 2026)









Hopefully, the public will see this as a great opportunity to find Willy his soulmate, as he has stood alone since his installation several decades ago. It would be a great way to celebrate the 100th year of Willits Frontier Days, and be another fun attraction to visitors of Willits and Mendocino County.

To help fundraise and continue to be a part of this fun craze - and maybe one of the only locations to have a matched pair?!, I propose a "Decide the" fundraiser — maybe at the Sweetheart Dinner? — where the highest bidder could select the decision for choices to be made, for a premium donation: Eye color, hair color, lip color, shirt color, skirt color, etc.? — and then the big buy: her name. (I throw "Wilma" or "Cowgirl Wilma" into the hat for my own enjoyment and hopeful inspiration for the highest bidder.)

Tax-deductible donations from businesses, individuals, and charity organizations could hopefully make up the rest of the amount needed over the two-year period. Advertising for the fundraiser could be done on the WFD Facebook and Instagram pages; in Willits Weekly and potentially other news outlets; contacts could be made with Roadside America or the Atlanta Museum, or other interested entities to help get the word out — or send in donations, too.

My husband Matthew and I traveled to Bell Plastics a few times; in August, they hold an annual open house where they show off all sorts of their creations, and let the public get up close, take photos, and see the fun statues. Go if you get the chance! They announce the event on their Facebook page: https://www.facebook.com/BellPlasticsHayward. We saw the Uniroyal gal there in 2019 and knew we had to get one up to Willits.

Let's make this a reality, and leave our mark on the 100th annual event.
